Meditation 10 Easter Day

Epistle reading: 1Corinthians 15.1-11, Evidence for the Resurrection

It appears that there were in the church at Corinth some converts who had denied elements of the gospel which Paul had preached to them. In particular they had denied the reality of the resurrection. Paul begins with an exhortation to stick to the exact words he used; then he goes on to cite the historical evidence for the resurrection.

'I make known to you, brethren, the gospel which I preached to you, in which you stand, through which you are being saved, if you hold it fast in the very words I used. Unless you have believed in vain'.

Paul goes on to state that the gospel message which he preached was the very Gospel which he had received. 'That Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures, and that He was buried – The burial was of great importance since it showed the reality of His death, and also by implication the reality of His resurrection. These are real historical events.

Paul then recites a list of people who had seen Jesus alive after His resurrection. First He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time. Then He appeared to James, then to all the Apostles. Paul concludes his list of appearances by referring to Jesus' appearance to Paul himself. These are eye witnesses and their witness is to be believed.

The list reads a bit like a Creed and in fact it is lists such as this that stand behind the Creeds. The people in the list are eye-witnesses and therefore their testimony is important and trustworthy. In fact the resurrection and surrounding events are well attested and reliable.

On Easter Day we join together to celebrate the spiritual power of the resurrection and we can confidently feel ourselves to be participating in salvation history.
