For receipt purposes please include your name and or giving number in the reference box Meditation 15 for the 6th Sunday of Easter, Peter and Cornelius, God's initiative and the divine Plan, Acts of the Apostles 10.44-48.

Our reading from Acts consists of the last four verses of Luke's account of Peter's vision of the sheet held by its four corners and let down from heaven. The sheet contains animals of all sorts, clean and unclean as designated by the Jewish Law. Peter is told to kill and eat. He refuses and is rebuked by the divine voice. The vision prepares Peter to respond positively when gentile men appear at his door. Gentiles were regarded as unclean by the Jews. Christians must learn that God has no favourites. In response to his vision Peter goes with the men to Caesarea where Cornelius has also had a vision telling him to send and fetch Peter from Joppa. Peter will explain Christianity and the nature of faith to Cornelius and his friends and relations.

When Peter and his companions arrive at Caesarea they are greeted by a gathering of God-fearers anxious to hear Peter's message. Luke gives us an outline of the sermon: Jesus and the Galilean ministry of healing, the message of peace and inclusiveness; the nature and work of the Holy Spirit; the death and resurrection of Jesus. Peter concludes by witnessing to his personal experience of the risen Christ. Before he even finishes speaking the Holy Spirit descends on the Gentiles and they experience the glossolalia (speaking in tongues), the outward sign of the Spirit.

The Jewish Christians who have accompanied Peter are very surprised that Gentiles have received the gift of the Holy Spirit, but God has no favourites. The visions and the messages reflect a divine Plan. Peter's ready response shows that he understood God's Plan to include the Gentiles in the Christian Church. It is important that we too understand and practice inclusiveness. We are within God's Plan and should respond to His call/s. We notice that the initiative is with God at every stage. We can make our baptism a token of a life of discipleship in response to God's many-faceted Plans. As with the Ethiopian eunuch last week it is by baptism that we are incorporated into the Church.
